M: Honey, it's a bit cold in here.

W: Good idea. Actually, it's unhealthy to maintain a high indoor temperature during winter.

W: Because it makes a bigger temperature gap between indoors and outdoors. And it can negatively affect your body.

Its name comes from merchants called *Banias*, who rested in the shade of this tree. The banyan tree is the national tree of India, where it's considered sacred, and its linked roots and branches are sometimes used to symbolize the country's unity.

Since the roots run from the branches to the ground, they support the tree. That's why it can grow very large—up to 200 meters in diameter. Because it's so big, it provides abundant shade, so it's frequently planted near homes and villages to provide some coolness. Besides providing shade, banyan trees have several other uses. The bark is suitable for making paper, and the roots are used to make rope. In addition, medicinally, the sap of the tree is used to treat skin problems, and its seeds are used to treat patients with diabetes. Pretty amazing, right? Now let's look at the historical relationship between this tree and religions.

13번 다음을 듣고, 야생동물에게 소량의 먹이를 불규칙적으로 주어야 하는 이유로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, everybody. Welcome to Florida Wildlife Volunteer Center. I'm sure most of you want to interact with the wildlife here, and it's possible to feed some of the animals. But you must know the right way to feed them while you volunteer. So please consider these four things when feeding the wildlife here. First, ensure you're going to be safe while feeding the wild animals. Second, ask yourself if the situation could cause the animals any problems. Third, only feed animals a small amount on an irregular basis so they'll retain their natural food-finding skills. Lastly, feed them food that would be similar to their natural diet. Please keep these points in mind while you stay here.

M: Hi. How can I help you?

W: I'll take the Orchid Room. What's the rental fee?

M: It's 350 dollars for four hours and 750 dollars a day.

W: We'll need it for a full day. Do you have a service that provides light refreshments?

M: Yes, we do, for an extra 200 dollars. Then your total would be 950 dollars.

16번 Rongorongo Script에 관한 다음 내용을 듣고, 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, class. I hope everybody had a good lunch. Today, in our third class on Polynesian culture, we're going to talk about the Rongorongo Script. This was a writing system for the Easter Island language, Rapanui. Amazingly, it was created by only a few hundred native islanders without the aid of the outside world. It had about 120 symbols, mainly representations of birds, fish, plants, and some geometric shapes. In the 1860s, a priest visiting Easter Island saw wooden samples of the writings, but couldn't find any native willing and able to translate the writings. Although a number of attempts have been made to decode them, none have been completely successful. Let me show you some pictures of the writings.
